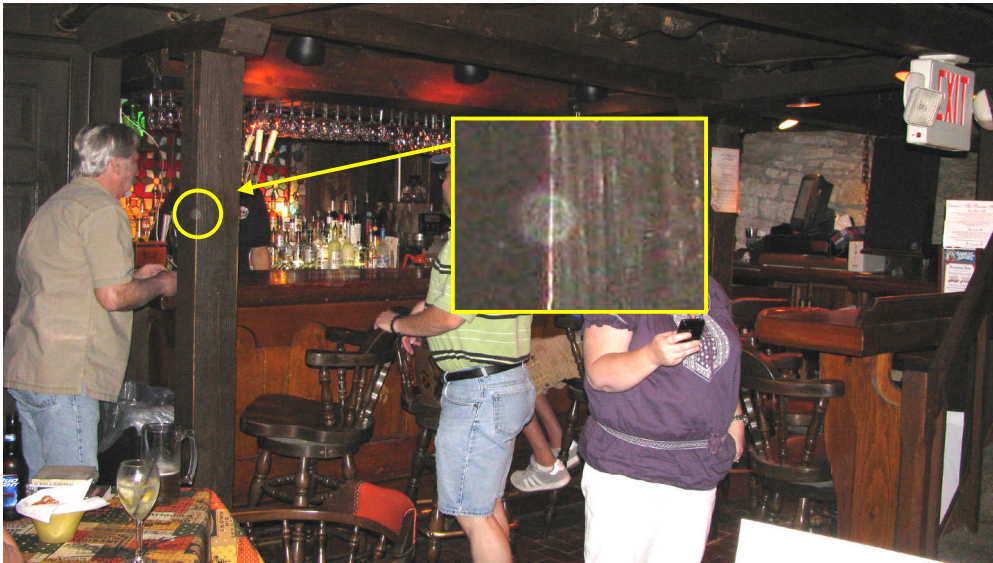
There are three spirits who are most often seen at the Inn--Bonnie Bounell (The lady in Blue), Orrin Granger, the original owner, and Major Buxton. All three had owned and operated the Inn at one time or the other over the past 200 years. They loved the place so much, they never left. And there's also a spirit of a gray cat that enjoys sleeping with some of the guests on occasion. The Orrs own and operate the Inn at the present time. We talked with an Orr family member, who was very open and accommodating to our investigation.



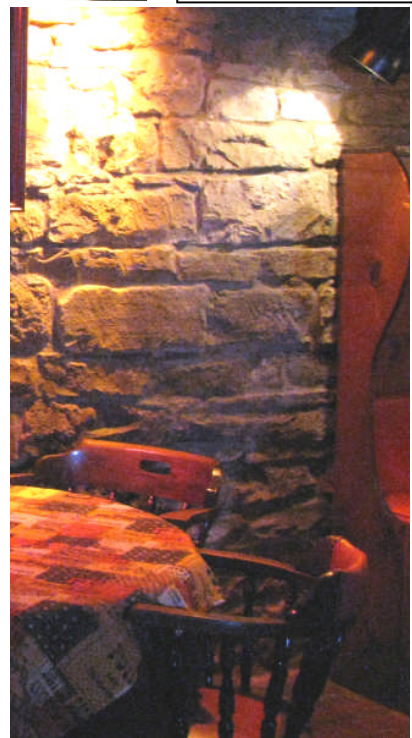

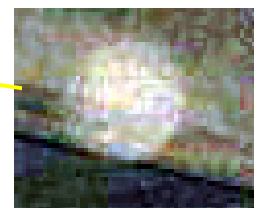


In the first photo, (Pat E.) upper left, you can see a faint blue fog near the chair and the wall. The enlargement of the area in the photo above shows it more clearly. The photo on the left was taken seconds after the first photo, using the same camera, and there is no blue mist in the shot. Could this have been the Lady in Blue dropping by?



Darlene took this photo (above) of the front corner of the Inn. The two upper windows with the shades drawn is Room #9, where we stayed. I noticed that in the window that is under the upstairs deck there appeared to be someone peering out at us while we were taking the photos. The photograph I took a few seconds later (left) did not show this mysterious figure in it. Darlene and I were standing right next to each other while taking these photographs.

Below – This is an orb Darlene captured in the basement wine cellar area. There is a door in this area that opens and closes by unseen hands on a regular basis. Also in this area are news articles about the spirits at the Inn. They are posted all over the walls, and are quite impressive.
